Concert Etíquette

Please read through and follow these commonly held rules of attending a music performance in a concert hall venue.

- 1. All sounds in the concert hall should come from the Musicians...
 - not you. ©
 - Please SILENCE your PHONE.
 - Please do not talk or whisper during the songs.
 - Please unwrap any cough drops or hard candy (to help a dry throat) BETWEEN songs, not during.
 - Please beware of unintended noise from
 - o jewelry or watch alarms
 - o purse snaps
 - o velcro on wallets or shoes
 - o cameras they should be set to silent.
 - Please keep all movement in your seat to a minimum.
 - If a small child becomes restless, please feel free to take them out of the concert hall immediately as to keep from ruining the performance.
- 2. There should be no movement in the concert hall during a song.
 - Movement should only occur <u>between</u> songs and should happen quickly before the next song begins.
 - Movement during a song should only occur in the case of a distressed child or emergency.
- 3. Please be respectful of the performers and applaud only when the performer or conductor signals the end of a song.
 - Please refer to your program to see if a musical selection has different segments listed. If so, always wait until after the final segment (movement) to applaud.
 - Whistling, shouting, or other wild noises are not appropriate. (Please save those for sporting events.) ©
 - Any standing ovation is usually saved until after the final piece of music in a concert is completed.
